



MBTC Meeting Time Change January 2014

Should the MBTC change the start time of its monthly general meeting, held on the second Wednesday of each month, excluding August & December when dark, from 7:00 pm to 6:00 pm? • There was lots of discussion, both pro and con. There was lots of discussion, both pro and con. A member indicated that moving the start time earlier may result in some late arrivals because people would be coming from work. Another member indicated that only 2 Area Reps were in attendance at this meeting and that he would like to see all of the Area Reps attend. Someone else indicated that we should consider using some kind of temporary street signage to indicate that the MBTC meeting would be held that night. Another person suggested we could also put MBTC meeting notices in local coffee shops. Finally, a vote was taken and the proposal was passed, 13 votes to 3. with Pacifica Real Estate Services, Inc., reported that the California Coastal Commission would be Centennial Banners March 2014 Will the MBTC, as a tax-exempt entity, be the responsible party on behalf of the Mission Beach Community's Centennial Banner Program to be established under a Special Resolution by the City of San Diego that will grant responsibility for one-year to install civic celebratory banners on light posts in the public-right-of-way along an established route in the community? (All costs of this banner program will be borne by the MBCC and its sponsors, including permits and general liability insurance.) Debbie Watkins, Chair of the Mission Beach Centennial Committee regarding the Centennial Banner Program said she is working with Ian Clampett from the Mayor's office to find a way to get permission to hang celebratory banners. Since she contacted Scott Morrison to include this voting item on the agenda, OMBAC has stepped-up and agreed to be the responsible party. She asked that the MBTC vote to serve as a back-up in case OMBAC is not able to be the responsible party. Following a discussion, it was moved and seconded to vote on this item. The vote passed, with 16 voting in favor and no opposition.
